

Hello My Friends! I hope that all is well with you! While this winter has proved very challenging, as a Family of Faith we have overcome everything that nature could produce! Our community may still have snow on the ground, the temperature may remain cool, and the skies above us may be gray, but our hearts our warmed by this Family of Faith and the presence of God.

As Christians, we live our spiritual lives on a journey of faith. From the moment we accept Jesus into our hearts and receive the Holy Spirit, God's Spirit will lead us towards being Christ-like in this life. We are never sure where God will lead us, although we know that God has our best interest in His heart. Abraham was called by God to follow His leading into the desert. He did not know where God would lead, yet by faith he followed. Genesis 12: 1-2 reveals the promise that God offers to Abraham,

"Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing." (NRSV)

Abraham received guidance and promises from God that served to shape the rest of his life. We too can rely on the promises of God and we can know His guiding presence. As we approach this Easter season, where is God leading you on your spiritual journey? How are you growing more Christ-like in your daily walk? Like Abraham, God is calling to each of us to grow in our spiritual lives, commitment to God, and knowledge of Jesus Christ.

March 5th is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Lenten season. Lent is a time of personal reflection, during which we can consider our relationship with God and to prepare our hearts for Easter morning. In the Roman Catholic tradition, people may choose to "Give Up" something for Lent or to offer a short-term sacrifice of something personal in acknowledgment of Christ's sacrifice for us. Rather than "giving up" television, video games, chocolate, etc..., let us embrace a transformational change in our spiritual lives. Ladies, you might consider joining the Monday morning Bible study. Men, you might consider the Prayer/Study on Saturday morning. Everyone might consider the Sunday morning Bible study, Tuesday Evening Prayer time, or the Book Study on Wednesday evening which are all available to us. The Holy Spirit may guide you to choose another approach to Christian growth. Rather than "Giving up" something of little significance or sacrifice, let us follow the Spirit's leading and grow in our faith and knowledge of God.





CHURCH FINANCES

A letter has been sent out regarding an opportunity for the Tawas Methodist Church to be debt free. On December 20, 2025, there will be a balloon payment due on the church mortgage loan. Twelve days later on January 1, 2026, the Disaffiliation Notes will mature. The plan has been to refinance this total amount of in a new mortgage loan,.

Recently, three individuals have come forward with an offer to eliminate the church debt and the monthly debt service obligation. Each of these individuals has offered to provide one-fourth of the debt, three-fourths altogether, if the remaining one-fourth, can be raised from the congregation. This one-time amount would be new money in addition to the expenses required annually for church operations. however, the need annually for debt service would be eliminated.

The purpose of this letter is to take a straw vote to see if this course of action can at all be considered. We are asking that you prayerfully consider the extent to which you would be able to contribute to the elimination of the church debt. Donations can be of cash or Disaffiliation Notes or both. Then, anonymously complete the enclosed form and no later than March 15 return it to the church office or place it in the mailbox of Candy Thomas, Chair of the Finance Committee.

Thank you for considering this opportunity. The church will proceed in whatever manner is indicated by your responses.

St. Patrick's Day has been celebrated here in Ireland for around 1,000 years - dating back to the ninth century. Historians believe the first parade to celebrate St. Patrick's Day took place on March 17, 1601, however, it wasn't actually in Ireland - instead, it took place in a Spanish colony known as St. Augustine, Florida. The parade and celebrations were created by the Spanish colonies Irish Vicar Ricardo Artur.

In 1848, the Official New York City St. Patrick's Day parade began, today it's one of the largest parades in America, with over 150,000 people taking part each year - with almost 3 million people watching!

Did you know that the color green wasn't always the national symbol for St. Patrick's Day? History reveals that the color was originally blue! However, this changed to the color green, as it represents Ireland as an island, along with its leafy green views, and it's named as 'the emerald isle' History of wearing green dates back to 18th century, and the popularity of shamrocks rose.
